We were given a broad brief to create a studio fit for a teaching environment, Brian Johnson, Television Manager at the University of Surrey, reveals. The television studio, which is open five days a week, is used on a daily basis by students, as well as for Media Training courses, designed for professionals within education and industry.

The television studio has been designed and fitted with diversity in mind; it's used to produce content for both the University's television media degree course, and also for the Guildford School of Acting.

The University of Surrey uses full HD through the studio, with Apple's Final Cut Pro for editing. Brian Johnson is already looking towards JVC's latest cameras too.
